The Way

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION FOR ADULTS BEGINS SUNDAY, OCTOBER 6TH!

I am the way, the truth, and the life (John 14:6).

"The Way" was the among the earliest names for followers of the Risen Christ. The Way also appears as a biblical reference to the earliest Christian communities in the Acts of the Apostles. In addition, tradition teaches that both before and after his conversion, Saint Paul referred to the disciples of Christ as part of the Way. More than two thousand years later, Catholic Christians are still part of the Way of Jesus Christ. But as we all know, a life of discipleship is not a hobby or pastime. It is a vocation, a way of life that lays claim to our whole heart, mind, and strength. As disciples, our lives should be focused on and inspired by our faith in Christ, who is our merciful redeemer, friend, and brother. And as disciples, we are called to reach out to those who need our help in growing closer to Christ and the Church.

If you are an adult (age 18 and over) and have not received all of the Sacraments of Initiation in the Catholic Church (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation), then please consider joining "The Way", a new adult faith formation program that will meet on Sunday mornings after our 8:15am Mass beginning on Sunday, October 6th in Saint Ann House of Prayer. The Way (typically called the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) is a seven month program that prepares adults to be received into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. As part of this same program, we will prepare adults for the Sacrament of Confirmation (to be received at either the Easter Vigil or at a regional archdiocesan celebration). Other parishioners who have received the Sacraments are also welcome to join us!

Our group will meet every other week for fellowship, formation, and faith sharing. As a community of disciples, we will learn together about the basic beliefs, teachings, and traditions of the Church; and we will explore the methods of prayer and spirituality that have brought centuries of believers closer to Christ Jesus and to the Church. In addition, we will talk openly and honestly about the challenges of living an authentic life of faith, hope, and love in the modern world. OUR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Sharing the Wisdom of Time

Last week, eighty-seven friends and fellow parishioners joined Cliff Garvey and me for all or part of our Sixth Annual Summer Retreat: "Sharing the Wisdom of Time with Pope Francis." Over the course of five nights, we reflected on a beautiful book by the same name in which Pope Francis and dozens of men and women, from all walks of life, from all around the world, shared their lives and wisdom. We also shared our own experiences and memories, accumulated over long years, during both good and hard times. We laughed together, cried together, and offered each other the kind of mutual love, compassion, and understanding that would have so pleased the Holy Father. Our goal was to pray about how to share the wisdom of faith with the young people that we love — not so much with words, but by how we live as disciples.

Each evening on retreat, we focused on a different theme: work, struggle, love, death, and hope. Each of these themes can provoke compelling memories that have the potential to transform every human life. In his nightly reflections, Cliff skillfully wove his own family experiences into what we learned from Pope Francis and those interviewed for the book. What we found most thought-provoking was not what someone might have said, but what someone actually did in their life. We learned that good works and virtuous actions spoke more powerfully than words. Our loved ones and those we read about lived the Gospel and shared God's love by preaching with their whole lives, not just with words. Nevertheless, Cliff and I assembled five quotations from the retreat that we felt give voice to the spirit of last week's prayers, reflections, and faith sharing:

HEALING GOD'S FAMILY & REBUILDING OUR CHURCH AN EVENING OF PRAYER with MYCHAL JUDGE WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 11TH - BEGINS AT 6:00PM

More than eight centuries ago, the Crucified Christ called out to the young man who would become Saint Francis of Assisi: "Go! Rebuild my church which as you can see is falling into ruin!" Francis took the Lord's command literally and set out to repair small chapels in and around his hometown. Over the years, however, Francis came to understand more fully that his vocation to live the Gospel and share God's love was vital to rebuilding the Church all around our suffering world.

In this spirit and in appreciation for the ongoing crisis facing the Roman Catholic Church in our own time, the Catholic Community of Gloucester & Rockport has gathered throughout this year on a regular basis in commemoration of various feast days and important memorials to pray for the healing of God's family and for the courage to rebuild our wounded church. In addition, we have also begged the saints to pray for us and to guide us in the hard work of discipleship during these difficult times.

All are invited to join us for our next Evening of Prayer for the Healing of God's Family on Wednesday, September 11th in commemoration of the 18th anniversary of the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001; and to reflect on the life and spirituality of Father Mychal Judge, who is recorded as the first official victim of those attacks. This special evening of prayer will begin at 6:00pm with Evening Prayer and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. At 6:30pm, we will pray the Holy Rosary for the healing of God's family. And at 7:15pm, we will conclude with Night Prayer and Benediction.

During Evening Prayer, Cliff Garvey will offer a brief reflection on the life and legacy of Father Mychal Judge, who was a Franciscan Friar, the chaplain for the New York City Fire Department, and widely known for his boundless care and compassion for the poor, the sick, and the addicted. We hope and pray that you and your family will be able to join us for all or even just part of this special evening of prayer, reflection, and devotion.
