

The Franciscan Virtues Fifty-Two Steps to Conversion

SATURDAY, JANUARY 3RD AT 8:00AM

The coming year marks two important anniversaries in the life of the Catholic Church. It is the 10th Anniversary of the Extraordinary Year of Mercy (2016) and the 800th Anniversary of the Transitus (Death) of Saint Francis of Assisi. As part of its ongoing mission to help us more faithfully live the Gospel of the Poor Christ in the spirit of Saint Francis and Saint Clare, the Assisi Project is going back to the basics, back to the life and good example of our patron saint and his first followers.

On the First Saturday of every month, the Assisi Project gathers for a two-hour mini-retreat that includes Holy Mass, a reflection by Father Jim or Brother Patrick, and a period of prayer and faith sharing. All are invited to join us on Saturday, January 3rd beginning at 8:00am in Our Lady of Good Voyage Church as we begin our reading and discussion of an amazing book called *Franciscan Virtues Through the Year: Fifty-Two Steps to Conversion*.

This beautiful but sometimes challenging little book includes fifty-two weekly short reflections on the virtues practiced by Saint Francis of Assisi and the saints and sinners who have tried to follow him during the past eight centuries. In January, for example, we will read and reflect on *Attentiveness, Confession, Courage*, and *Detachment*. At our monthly gatherings, we will focus on one of more of these compelling Franciscan virtues.

Founded in 2007 by Father Jim and Brother Patrick, the Assisi Project is a Fellowship of Franciscans in Spirit with friends and followers around the world. We are dedicated to helping believers of all ages more faithfully live the Good News in the spirit of Saint Francis and Saint Clare of Assisi. OUR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

We Need Each Other

In a recent address to recipients of the Zayed Award for Human Fraternity, Pope Leo said: "In a time marked by increased conflict and division, we need authentic testimonies of human kindness and charity to remind us that we are all brothers and sisters. Words are not enough. Indeed, our love and our deepest convictions must be continually cultivated; and we do this through our concrete actions." Here in our small corner of the world, nestled between sea and sky, we are called by the Holy Father to prayerfully consider what it means to be a community; what it means to be a family of disciples that prays together, works together, and journeys together in search of the peace, truth, and justice that the Christ Child offers us at Christmas.

At this time of year, our churches are more crowded than usual. This is a great blessing. Some of the people you see are here each weekend. Some come to church once or twice each month. Some join us once or twice each year. And some are taking a chance on God and on us. Do we welcome them with open arms and open hearts? Do we make room for them in our favorite pew? Do we greet them with a smile, kind word, or best wishes for the Christmas Season? When we do these things, we do more to nurture our shared faith than any hymn, any homily, or any parish program could ever do.

Let's be honest. We are living during a time when too many people are afraid, angry, and anxious about the future. We grieve over so much that has been lost. We distrust so many of our civic and religious leaders. We lack faith in our institutions. We feel alienated from each other. We lack a sense of belonging to our community and to one another. All too many of us do not come home to church because we don't see the point, because we don't feel welcome, or because we don't feel worthy to be here. But as Pope Francis (1936-2025) so often reminded us: "We all need each other. Our greatest and yet most fragile treasure is our shared humanity as brothers and sisters, as children of God. And none of us can be saved alone."

As this year ends and a new year begins, it is long past time for us and for the Universal Church to embrace the reality that we cannot prevail against the darkness of these times by retreating into our comfort zones. First Pope Francis and now Pope Leo call us to be a community of missionary disciples that opens wide the doors; welcomes the stranger; embraces those who feel left behind; and preaches the Good News of Jesus with every thought, word, and deed. It is long past time for us — all of us — to become instruments of God's peace and fraternity in a world that is being torn apart by hatred, bigotry, division, and violence.

At Christmas and beyond, let us renew our core values of prayer, fellowship, and service. Let us reaffirm our mission to live the Gospel, share God's love, and rebuild the Church. Let us open our hearts, our minds, and our arms to embrace anyone and everyone who seeks to know the Lord. Pope Francis once said: "The time has come for all of us to endeavor to hear our society and our planet, to lay the foundations for a more just and peaceful world, and to seriously commit ourselves to pursuing the common good." In this spirit, let us pray together. Let us walk together. And let us work together to take care of each other and our common home. On behalf of our senior priests and pastoral team, welcome home for the holidays! Thank you for your encouragement and generous support of our beloved home parishes!
